

Market Overview- Hospitality Industry

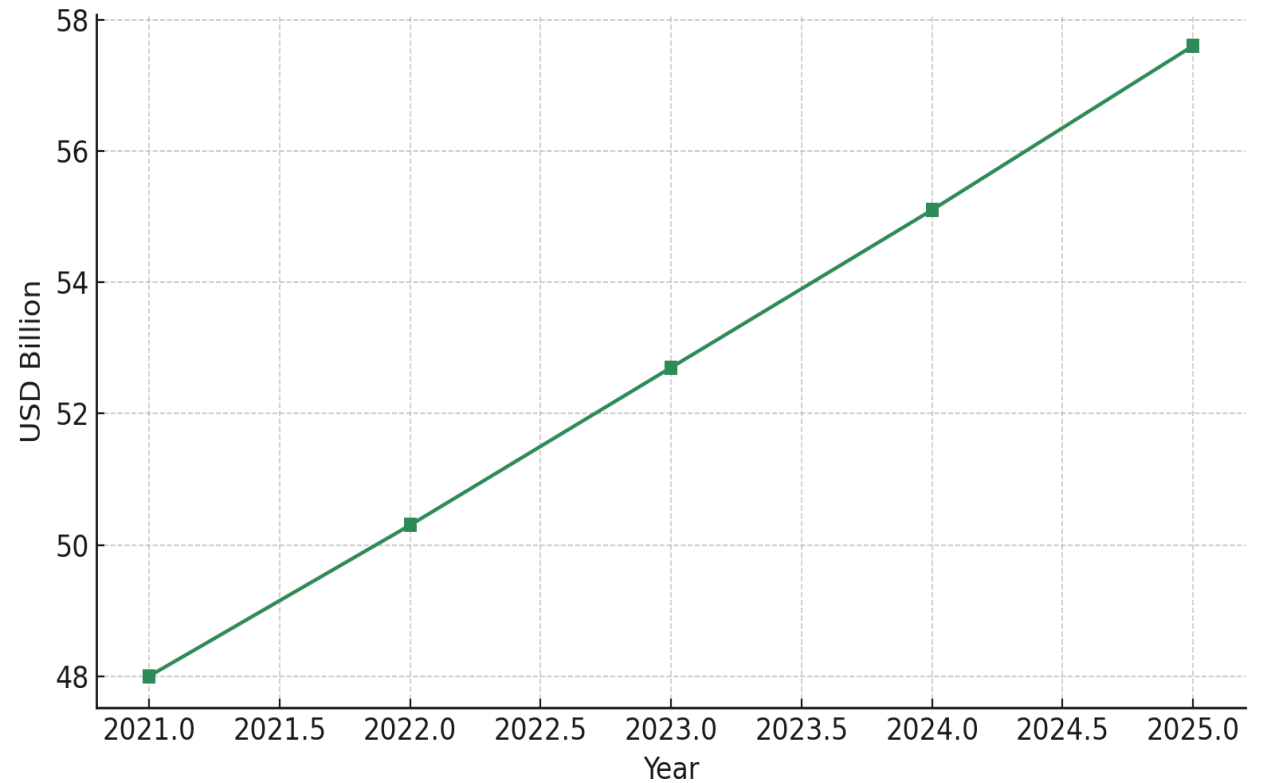

The state's expansive geography and favorable climate contribute to a thriving sector encompassing outdoor activities, hospitality, and entertainment.



Economic Contributions & Employment

The leisure and hospitality sector in Texas is a major economic driver, with outdoor recreation alone contributing \$55.8 billion to the state's economy in 2023, accounting for 2.16% of the state's GDP. Employment in the sector has seen a 2.7% increase, reflecting the industry's resilience and growth potential.
